Campus Equity Week is October 28 - November 2, 2013

- 50% of higher education faculty work as low-paid adjuncts.
- Student debt totals 1.4 trillion.
- Campus workers and college grads receive poverty-level wages.
- Corporate-led “reform” is heading from K-12 to higher ed
- Race and gender inequities pervade student access to higher ed

Campus Equity Week (CEW) is a week of education and activism to shine a spotlight on our increasingly stratified higher education system. Denial of healthcare in response to the Affordable Care Act; student debt; equity issues for students, staff, and/or faculty of color; the dangers of blind faith in MOOCs/online education; equity issues in curriculum “reform;” the attack on public higher education -- these are many of the issues that will be addressed during this important week.

At the core of the inequities that pervade higher education is the crisis of contingent faculty employment. Campus Equity Week was devised by faculty activists in 2001 in order to highlight the appalling working conditions of the majority of the faculty and the impact of those working conditions on the quality of education. **A central principle of CEW 2013 is that quality education depends practically and ethically on professional and just working conditions for all faculty.**

Join us to fight for quality and equality in higher education: organize local actions that advance our national campaign.
